The promises of God are often fulfilled in unexpected ways. The passage from Romans powerfully reminds readers that God’s love is present even in the midst of tribulation, and that God’s purposes are being furthered, even if outward appearances would indicate otherwise. In Matthew, Jesus likens the kingdom of God to a mustard seed or yeast—they may have small beginnings but can grow into something much larger.


