This morning's lesson from Zechariah offers words of hope and encouragement to the people of Israel who experience exile as a form of imprisonment. In Romans, Paul wrestles honestly with the weight of his sin and his frequent failures to live the life worthy of the freedom found in Christ. He states, "I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do...who will rescue me from this body of death?" The gospel lesson from Matthew provides words of comfort to those similarly weighed down by life's struggles, as Jesus invites, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest."

At the close of today's service, the Lord's Supper will be celebrated in the Memorial Chapel located to the left of the chancel. Immediately following the Lord's Supper, a service of prayer for healing will be held. The service consists of prayers for healing and wholeness, with anointing and laying on of hands. All are invited.

The congregation is asked to remain silent during the prelude as a time of prayer and meditation.
