The scripture lessons this week both focus on the shape of the Christian life. In his letter to the Colossians, Paul encourages the followers there to "lead lives worthy of the Lord," and to commit their lives to sanctification and a life of fruitful obedience. Luke tells the parable of the Good Samaritan. Because Samaritan has become a well-known term to refer to do-gooders, some of the original shock of the message is lost. In Jesus' time, Samaritans were a despised ethnic minority. Yet in this parable the Samaritan is held up as an example of one who understands what it means to be a neighbor.
