Judgment is a term we rarely associate with freedom. Yet Deborah's wise judgment and guidance of the unfaithful Israelites ultimately enabled them to be freed from their oppressors. In Matthew's parable of the talents, the master has harsh judgment for the slave who horded his coin rather than risk investment and growth. Sometimes judgment calls us to honest reflection and frees us to be a people who take risks for the growth and flourishing of the kingdom. The readings between All Saints Sunday and the season of Advent turn our attention to God's final judgment, and cause us to reflect on the crucial judgments that make up our own lives in light of God's judgment. This morning we also commission our 39 new PathWays Chapel scholars.

At the close of today's service, the Lord's Supper will be celebrated in the Memorial Chapel located to the left of the chancel. Immediately following the Lord's Supper, a service of prayer for healing will be held. The service consists of prayers for healing and wholeness, with anointing and laying on of hands. All are invited.

The congregation is asked to remain silent during the prelude as a time of prayer and meditation.

ABOUT TODAY'S GUEST PREACHER

Today we are pleased to welcome the Rev. Barbara Brown Taylor as the Sterly and Pelham Wilder, Jr., Distinguished Guest Preacher. She is the Butman Professor of Religion at Piedmont College in rural northeast Georgia. An Episcopal priest since 1984, Barbara Brown Taylor is the author of twelve books, including the New York Times bestseller *An Altar in the World*, published by HarperOne in 2009. Her first memoir, *Leaving Church*, met with widespread critical acclaim, winning a 2006 Author of the Year award from the Georgia Writers Association. The Rev. Taylor and her husband Ed live on a working farm in the foothills of the Appalachians with wild turkeys, red foxes, two old Quarter horses, and too many chickens.
